We are thrilled at the support from 2017 staff and students who continue to do an incredible amount of work to continue to ensure this program is thoroughly supported.**

Many studies have shown that eating breakfast can improve memory and concentration levels and it can also make us happier as well as improve one's mood and lower stress levels.

Breakfast is an important meal of the day as it gives our students the best opportunity to start their day and be ready to learn. The Breakfast Club presents students with opportunities to develop other skills such as a Food Handling Certificate delivered by our Food Technology teacher, Mr Barnes. Our Group Leaders are also learning about keeping records, writing shopping lists based on weekly evaluations of produce used and calculating what needs to be ordered for future use.



The club is also a social event as it brings students of all ages together to talk and share in a fun experience. We have been very fortunate to receive a Freezer donated by The Good Guys to support our program.

A note from our College Director, Brendan O'Brien

Dear parents and friends of Carranballac College,

I do hope everyone had a lovely Easter break with family and friends and students are refreshed and ready for term 2 studies.

Term 2 has commenced with two short weeks of classes and we have taken this opportunity to have planning days for teams across the College rather than spread specialist programs across the two weeks. This has provided staff with quality time together to ensure that we have consistent programs in place across the teams and the College into the future. We will evaluate the effectiveness of this approach before continuing it.

Thankyou to our community for supporting the College with the **Professional Learning day** on Monday. Staff undertook a range of professional learning activities including First Aid Level 11 and CPR refreshers, Department of Education initiatives – FISO (Framework for Improving Student Outcomes) training, School Wide Positive Behaviours and Moderation of student outcomes workshops. We were also privileged to hear a presentation from Alana MacIntosh on her Rotary exchange to The Philippines. An incredibly valuable day capably organised by Mrs Hall and our team of College coaches.

**ANZAC** – Our College has a proud and connected history in honouring the ANZAC's. Our links to the defence services is strong through the involvement of families and staff within our community. The two assemblies that were conducted on Friday reflected our strength of commitment to and understanding of the ANZAC memory. I was extremely proud of our students for the most respectful manner in which they were audience members at both assemblies. My special thanks to Chriss Barker our Defence Coordinator for her support in the organisation of this event, to Ms Colston-Ing and Mr Montgomery for their singing and to our student performers Leilani, Sara, Sienna and Jordan. Each year I am moved and touched by the respect our young people demonstrate at this important national service. Our Year 9 students successfully completed 4 days of personal challenges at their Cave Hill camp last week. Students were supported to learn important outdoor skills, ably coordinated and led by Mr Beiers. My thanks to those involved for another successful Carranballac College camp. Our college has an amazing Outdoor Ed program and I encourage our families to take advantage of these opportunities wherever possible. Such excursions promote confidence and self-esteem whilst creating great life-long memories.

During the last week of term 1 our Middle Years students were treated to an inspirational talk from Emmanuel Jal. Coordinated by the Werribee Police, Emmanuel spoke of his early life in South Sudan and the tragic experiences that are the basis for his autobiography, *War Child: A Child Soldier's Story*. ### **Wakakirri**

Carranballac College has a proud history of successful involvement in the national performing arts competition, Wakakirri. In this competition, participating schools create stories using dance, song, story-telling, film, arts and writing. Established in 1992, Wakakirri is Australia's largest arts festival for schools involving over 30,000 students in every State and Territory. Wakakirri has live events in 28 locations, a live audience of 60,000 and online events involving 20,000.

Our Wakakirri entry this year will involve Jamieson Way Year 5/6 students. A limitation on numbers has allowed us to make Wakakirri part of a performing arts option for term 2. Therefore there will be eighty students involved in Wakakirri and eighty students involved in a drama unit which will run alongside the production. Class teachers will be conducting auditions this week and the first week of term 2 for interested students.

As well as talent we are looking for students who can demonstrate initiative and independence. Students will be informed if they have made the production early in term 2.

Our story is titled 'The Night We Made the Flag' (a Eureka Story) by Carole Wilkinson and tells the story of the making of the Eureka Flag.

The heats of Wakakirri will be held at the Clocktower Theatre in Moonee Ponds on 26th – 28th July, & 31st July 2017. You will be sent information regarding the confirmed performance dates and tickets early in term 2.

There will be costs. We will endeavour to keep costs to a minimum. In most cases, costumes, theatre make-up, props and sets will be provided by the college. Costs to you will include:

- bus transport to and from the performance venue for participants
- tea and snacks on the evening of the performance for participants
- theatre tickets at the theatre for family members attending
- optional DVDs and/or photographs.

### River Detectives

In 2017 a group of students at Carranballac College are undertaking a trial project with Melbourne Water, entitled 'River Detectives'. The trial involves a water quality testing program on the two wetlands at Jamieson Way Campus (Cheetham Creek) and at Boardwalk campus (Point Cook Township Wetlands).

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The trial involves a water quality testing program on the two wetlands at Jamieson Way Campus (Cheetham Creek) and at Boardwalk campus (Point Cook Township Wetlands).

Students from each campus will work on the project, along with other schools across Melbourne, including St Peter Chanel Deer Park, Overnewton College, Preshill Kew, Australian International Academy (Caroline Springs Campus) and Hume City. A kit of water quality measuring equipment has been provided to the school, and three of our staff have undertaken professional development on the program.

Students in the Environmental Leaders buddy groups will be involved in testing for:

- Phosphates
- Salinity
- Turbidity
- pH
- and others such as invertebrates (bugs)

It is planned to use the project in our Kids Teaching Kids workshops in various conferences in Terms 3 & 4.
