

What impact does being late have on the student?



Secondary Uniforms

Dear Secondary Families,

School uniform is **compulsory** at Carranballac College. In Term 3, students should be in **full winter uniform**.

The purpose of the uniform is to support student safety by ease of identification especially when they move to and from school and when they participate in their Specialist subjects. School uniform also promotes a sense of pride, equal status and inclusiveness amongst the students. Carranballac students, through the Student Representative Council, were involved in the selection process of the current uniform.

Compulsory school uniform includes the wearing of:



WINTER

- black school shoes with white socks
- navy soft-shell jacket (with Carranballac logo)
- short or long-sleeved buttoned collar pale blue shirt (with Carranballac logo)
- school tie
- navy gabardine pants or shorts
- woollen jumper (with Carranballac logo)
- college tartan box pleat skirt
- navy tights
- navy blue beanie (with Carranballac logo)

SPORTS UNIFORM - to be worn on scheduled PE and SPORT days only;

- short sleeved navy polo-shirt with emerald striped collar (with Carranballac logo)
- navy microfibre shorts
- navy fleecy trackpants
- navy soft-shell waterproof jacket (with Carranballac logo)
- appropriate sports footwear to be worn.

Only **school jackets** are approved to be worn throughout all parts of the day, including to and from school. It is suggested that if students are cold sensitive that they layer up underneath their jackets (no hooded jumpers). All items need to be **navy blue**, no black/white, or other colour options should be mixed into the uniform.

With the exception of a watch and one set of studs/sleeper earrings, jewellery is not to be worn. The wearing of makeup and false and brightly painted nails (clear nail polish is ok) is not acceptable. Hair that is longer than shoulder length needs to be tied up. On the odd occasion that students cannot wear appropriate school uniform to school, parents should provide a note to the classroom teacher on the day this happens. If students do not present with a note, the appropriate consequences will be put into place.

Please use the next three weeks to source any items your child is not currently wearing. The uniform shop is open on a regular basis. If parents wish to see samples of the uniform, these are available from the School Uniform Shop PSW Hoppers Crossing (see below for address and website).
