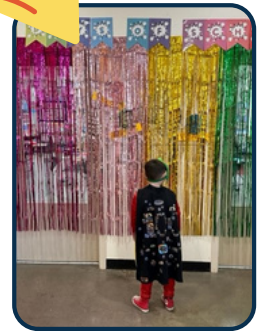
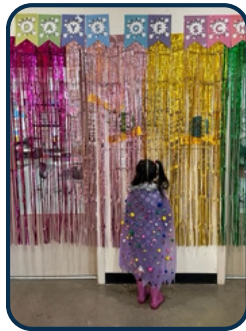
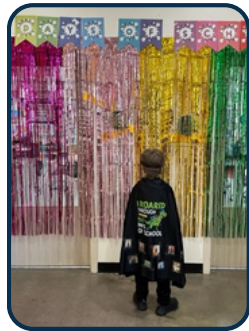
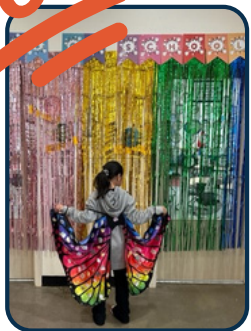
## NAPLAN- Individual Student Report

2023 was the first year that all NAPLAN testing was completed online for students across Australia. It presented questions to students in Years 3, 5, 7 & 9 tailored to an individual student's response- which has allowed for a more precise result in each of the curriculum areas assessed. There are also 4 new proficiency levels; exceeding, strong, developing and needs additional support. All families who have children in 3, 5, 7 & 9 received their child's individual report last week. 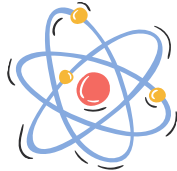

## National Science Week

National Science Week is coming on from the 12th-20th August with the theme Innovation: Powering Future Industries. The 2023 theme is particularly relevant with the rise in use of Artificial Intelligence. There are many ways you can develop your child's interest in Science- try a few of the following;

1. Build ramps using boxes, Lego, containers and anything else you have around the home- try rolling a marble down a ramp and experiment with how fast or slow you can make it go (structural engineering)
2. Go outside and observe the world around you; the clouds, rocks, trees, insects (biology)
3. Water play- fill up containers, pour, spray and make soapy water, watch items float, or sink- talk about what happens when you pour water from one container to a different sized container (liquid properties)
4. Follow weather patterns- chart the weather daily and look for trends, talk about how weather affects geographic areas differently, compare the weather of two places (meteorology)
5. Cooking experiments using different measurements and ingredients, observe chemical reactions and how heat and cold affects substances (chemistry)

# CREAM CORN FRITTERS

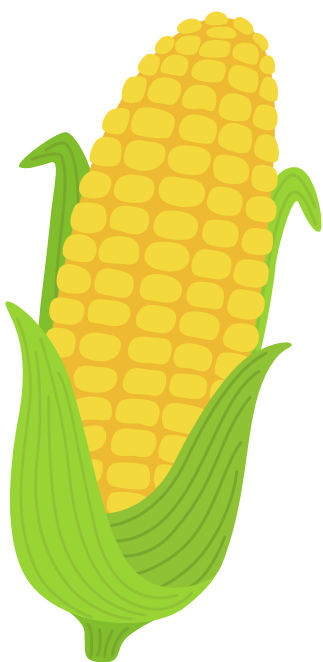
**SERVES 2**

Preparation Time: 10 minutes

Cooking Time: 15 minutes

## INGREDIENTS

- 2 eggs
- 1/3 cup self raising flour
- 1/2 cup grated cheese
- 1/3 cup cream corn
- 1/2 carrot (grated)
- 1 spring onion (chopped finely)
- 1 tbsp oil



## METHOD

1. Whisk together flour, eggs and oil.
2. Add remaining ingredients and mix well to combine.
3. Heat frypan over medium heat.
4. In batches, cook spoons full of batter for 2 minutes on each side or until golden brown.
5. Cool on a wire rack.

## 2023 Parent / Caregiver / Guardian Opinion Survey:

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WE WANT OUR PARENTS / CAREGIVERS / GUARDIANS TO TELL US WHAT THEY THINK!

Our school is conducting a survey to find out what parents / caregivers / guardians think of our school. The Parent / Caregiver / Guardian Opinion Survey is an annual survey offered by the Department of Education that is designed to assist schools in gaining an understanding of families' perceptions of school climate, student behavior, and student engagement. The survey is optional, but we encourage all families who have been randomly selected to participate. Our school will use the survey results to help inform and direct future school planning and improvement strategies.

A random sample of approximately 30 per cent of parents / caregivers / guardians has been selected to participate in this year's survey.

The Parent / Caregiver / Guardian Opinion Survey will be open from **Monday 7 August to Friday 8 September 2023**.

The survey will be conducted **online**, only takes **20 minutes** to complete, and can be accessed at any convenient time within the survey period on desktop computers, laptops, tablets or smartphones. The online survey will be available in English and 10 other languages including Arabic, Greek, Hakha Chin, Hindi, Japanese, Punjabi, Simplified Chinese, Somali, Turkish, and Vietnamese.

The school survey results are communicated to the community via the Annual Report. In 2022 our results indicated that you would like to see resilience taught to children, as a result of this we engaged The Resilience Project and are teaching our students the three elements of resilience; Gratitude, Empathy and Mindfulness.
