#### **RUOK? Day**



# CHANGES TO LATE ARRIVALS PROCESS

Students have eased their way into food tech already and we have had some fun making and decorating cupcakes in both Year 7 and Year 8 classes with a focus on design and the fundamental uses for ingredients used in baking. See the recipe on the following page for you to try at home.

Year 9 students tried something different and produced Rice Paper Dumplings using mushrooms and tofu as the filling. This lesson provided students with the skills to make these at home and encouraged creativity by experimenting with ingredients.

# CUPCAKES

### SERVES 12

Preparation Time: 15 minutes Cooking Time: 20 minutes

# INGREDIENTS

#### **Batter**

- · 1 cup SR flour
- · 65g butter
- · ¼ cup sugar
- · 1 egg
- · 100ml milk
- · 1 teaspoon vanilla

#### **Frosting**

- · 65g butter
- · 1 cup icing sugar, sifted
- · 1 Tablespoon cocoa powder (optional) sifted
- 1 Tablespoon milk
- · 1 teaspoon vanilla
- · Pinch salt






# METHOD

#### **Cupcakes:**

- 1.Preheat oven to 180°C.
- 2.Line 12 muffin cups with liners.
- 3.Using electric mixer, beat butter with sugar until light and fluffv.
- 4.Beat in egg, then add vanilla.
- 5.On low speed, gradually add flour alternately with milk and scraping bowl as needed in between additions.
- 6.Scoop into prepared liners and bake for 20 mins or until tester comes out clean when inserted into centre of cupcakes. Cool on wire rack.

#### Frosting:

- 7. Beat butter until light and fluffy. With mixer on low-speed beat in icing sugar, (cocoa powder if using), milk, vanilla and salt. Increase speed to high and beat for 2 minutes or until light and fluffy.
- 8. Decorate cooled cupcakes using piping bag or spoon icing onto cupcakes.
