

#### **Transition**

Our 2024 Foundation students will soon commence transition sessions at both campuses. This will run over three days: 28th November, 5th December and 12th December 9.00am to 10.30 am at each campus.

The Transition Program at Carranballac College takes many forms;

- Kindergarten to Foundation
- Year 6 to Year 7
- Year 9 to Senior Secondary Education
- Whole school transition from a student's existing grade into the next year level.

The purpose of the transition program is to familiarise the students with the classrooms, subjects, expectations and special activities (e.g. Grade 3/4 camp) and to reduce potential anxiety that may be felt by some students.

Our role in preparing our students for the next year will include classroom experiences, becoming familiar with other staff (who may or may not be the teachers in that level next year) and becoming familiar with other buildings or rooms in the school. Transition will continue into the beginning of the new year as our students settle into their new learning environments and are provided with induction programs to support their orientation to the new year level.

We understand that some students and their parents may be feeling a little anxious about the transition process and want to assure you that we will support the students both towards the end of this year but also next year as they re-establish existing friendships and develop new friendships at Carranballac College.




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


# **Student Recounts**

# BUTTER CHICKEN

### SERVES 2

Preparation Time: 15 minutes Cooking Time: 30 minutes

# INGREDIENTS

- ·Chicken:
- ·300g chicken thigh (cut into strips)
- ·1/4 cup plain yoghurt
- ·1 T each of ginger and garlic paste
- ·2 T chicken spices (garam masala, salt, turmeric, cumin)
- .½ t chilli powder
  - Sauce:
- ·1/2 onion (brunoise)
- ·1 T butter
- ·½ T tomato puree
- ·1 t ginger paste
- ·1 t garlic paste
- ·3 cardamon pods
- ·1½ T spice mix (ground coriander, turmeric, garam masala, ground cloves)
- 150ml cream



## METHOD

- 1. Mix together yoghurt (for chicken), ginger, garlic, chilli and spice mix. Add chicken. Let sit for 10 minutes
- 2. In a frypan, heat a little oil over medium heat. Add chicken, sauté for 5 minutes. Set aside.
- 3. In a large saucepan, melt butter. Add onions and tomato puree, sautéing until onions are tender. Add pods, spice mix (for sauce), ginger and garlic. Fry for 30 seconds to release aroma. Stir in cream and bring to a light boil.
- 4. Add chicken and cook for a further 2 minutes. Season to taste.

# NAAN BREAD AND RICE

### SERVES 2

Preparation Time: 15 minutes Cooking Time: 20 minutes

# INGREDIENTS

#### · Naan Bread

- ·1 cup plain flour
- ·½ cup plain yoghurt
- ·1 teaspoon baking powder
- ·Pinch salt
- ·1 Tablespoon butter
- ·1 teaspoon garlic

#### **Basmati Rice**

- ·1/2 cup basmati rice (rinsed)
- ·1 cup water



## METHOD

#### Naan

- 1. Combine all dry ingredients and whisk together.
- 2. Create a well in the middle and add yoghurt. Mix until it forms a ball. Turn out on the counter and knead until smooth and elastic.
- 3. Wrap in cling wrap and allow the dough to rest for 15 minutes.
- 4. Cut the dough into 4 equal pieces and roll out.
- 5. Heat a frying pan over medium heat. Cook each naan bread until it starts to puff up. Repeat on other side.
- 6. When cooked, place on plate and brush with garlic butter.
- 7. Repeat for each piece of dough.

#### Rice

1.Place rice and water in saucepan and bring to the boil. Once water has come to the boil, place lid on top and simmer for 15 minutes. Remove from heat and let sit until ready to serve.
