End of the year celebrations

Our students in Grade 6 and Year 9 are currently preparing for their upcoming end of the year celebrations scheduled for next Wednesday and Thursday afternoons respectively. Additionally, we are eagerly anticipating the F/1/2 picnic and performances next Tuesday after school. We extend a warm invitation for you to join us in commemorating these milestones, which will mark the culmination of a fantastic year. A strength of the community is its strong links to the school and we genuinely look forward to your presence next week. Together, let's celebrate the achievements of our Year 9 students as they transition to Senior Secondary Education and celebrate our Grade 6 students who are at the end of their primary school years.

End of the year assemblies will be taking place on Tuesday 19th December at 9am, an assembly will be held at each campus and families are warmly welcomed.

Transitions at Carranballac College- in preparation for 2024

As our teachers prepare students for the 2024 school year there are a number of school wide events supporting the transition;

Tuesday 12th December

State-wide transition day for 2024 Prep students, Year 7 students and students entering Year 10 at Senior Secondary. On this day we will also provide transition for our current Year 7 students going into year 8 and our Year 8 students going into year 9- they will experience a day in their 2024 year level.

Monday 18th December

2024 Years 1-6 students will spend 2 sessions with their 2024 class.

This transition session will take place after recess and will give students the opportunity to meet their new teacher and classmates.

It is natural for children to feel some degree of anxiety around a change for the following year. Their 2023 teacher/s and 2024 teacher/s are aware this is a time of change and will be supportive of all students. There are a number of ways you can support your child with a successful transition into their 2024 class;

- ·Talk to your child about the upcoming transition day/session and encourage them to approach the day with an open mind.
- ·Talk to your child about the transition after the event.
- ·Support your child to embrace the new experience of moving into a new year level.
- ·Celebrate the successes from 2023 and plan around their strengths for 2024.
- ·Encourage them to find a familiar face in their new surroundings, but also to reach out and speak to new people.

Mobile phones at school

A reminder that the Department of Education has in place a mobile phone ban that requires students who bring mobiles phones to school to have them switched off and securely put away during school hours.

The department is requiring all schools to ensure this ban is in place and enforced from the start of the 2024 school year.

The ban applies equally to all government schools right across the state.

This helps ensure that school is a learning environment free from unnecessary distractions and disruptions.

By ensuring mobile phones are kept away at recess and lunch times, students can interact with each other face-to-face, without the distractions and social pressures that mobile phones can cause.

I ask for the support of all our families, staff and students in continuing to support the implementation of this policy in our school. Further information about this will be available at the beginning of the 2024 school year.

Please note that students are not to use their mobile phone to pay for food at the canteen.

SCHOOL SPORTS AUSTRALIA NATIONAL ATHLETICS

On the 22nd of November I went to the National Athletics in Tasmania. Thursday was the opening ceremony. I was greeted by the hosts of the meet and watched the performance. I competed in discus, combine (shotput, 100m, 800m and long jump) shot put and medley relay.

On Friday I did discus, I came forth by 3cm, I threw 29.23m. On Saturday, the combine began. I did long jump and 100m, in 100 I ran 14:99 which is a PB (aka personal best) and in long jump I did 3.98m which is also a PB. Finally, on Sunday I did shot put (combined) where I threw 7.50m and 800m to end the combine I ran a PB with a time of 2minutes 39, then I did shot put (individual) I threw 7.72m after an 800m. I had to rush over to the call room once I was done to do the medley relay, in this event there was four people who worked together, two people did the 200m, one person did the 100m and finally the last runner did the 300m. I was the 300m runner and our team came second. Monday was a fun day where we dressed up and did activities, my group was dressed up as different colours (I was green). The groups competed in different events. The 10 year olds did shot put, which is what I did, the 11 year olds vortex and the 12 year olds did long jump. They also competed in the shuffle relay (8 by 80) and the 8 by 100 relay.

GINGERBREAD

SERVES 12

Preparation Time: 20 minutes Cooking Time: 10 minutes

INGREDIENTS

Gingerbread

- ·60g butter
- ·¼ cup brown sugar
- ·1/4 cup golden syrup
- ·1 egg yolk
- ·1 1/4 cups plain flour
- ·½ T ground ginger
- ·½ t mixed spice
- ·½ t bicarbonate soda
- ·Extra flour for dusting

Icing

- ·1 egg white
- ·1 cup icing sugar
- ·Food colouring





METHOD

- 1. Preheat oven to 180 degrees and line an oven tray with baking paper.
- 2. **COOKIES:** Cream butter and sugar until creamy. Add syrup and egg yolk beating until combined.
- 3. Stir in flour, ginger, spice and bicarb.
- 4. Place on floured surface and knead until smooth.
- 5. Roll out using a rolling pin until 4mm in thickness.
- 6. Cut shapes using biscuit cutters and place on baking tray.
- 7. Bake for 10 minutes or until golden brown.
- 8. **ICING:** Beat egg white until soft peaks form. Gradually add icing sugar and continue beating until stiff peaks form.
- 9. Divide mixture and add desired food colouring.
 Once biscuits have cooled, decorate using your icing
