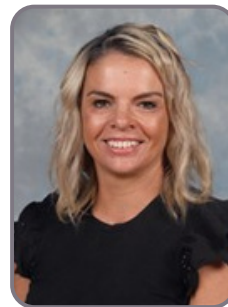

HOUSE COLOUR TEAMS SCHOOLYARD CLEANLINESS

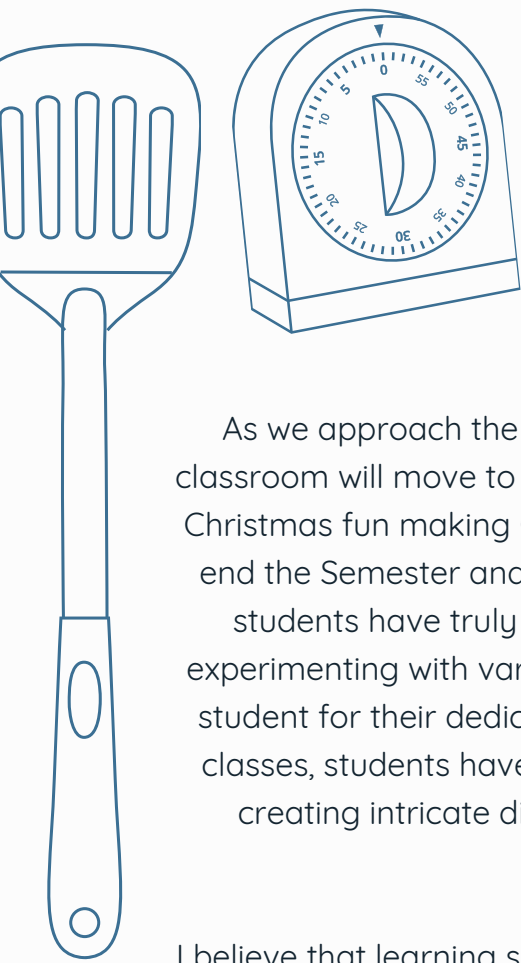

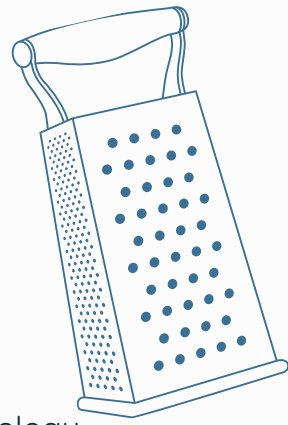

FOOD TECHNOLOGY

RECIPE OF THE WEEK

GINGERBREAD

Preparation Time: 20 minutes

Cooking Time: 10 minutes

Serves:

Gingerbread

- 60g butter
- $\frac{1}{4}$ cup brown sugar
- $\frac{1}{4}$ cup golden syrup
- 1 egg yolk
- 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ cups plain flour
- $\frac{1}{2}$ T ground ginger
- $\frac{1}{2}$ t mixed spice
- $\frac{1}{2}$ t bicarbonate soda
- Extra flour for dusting

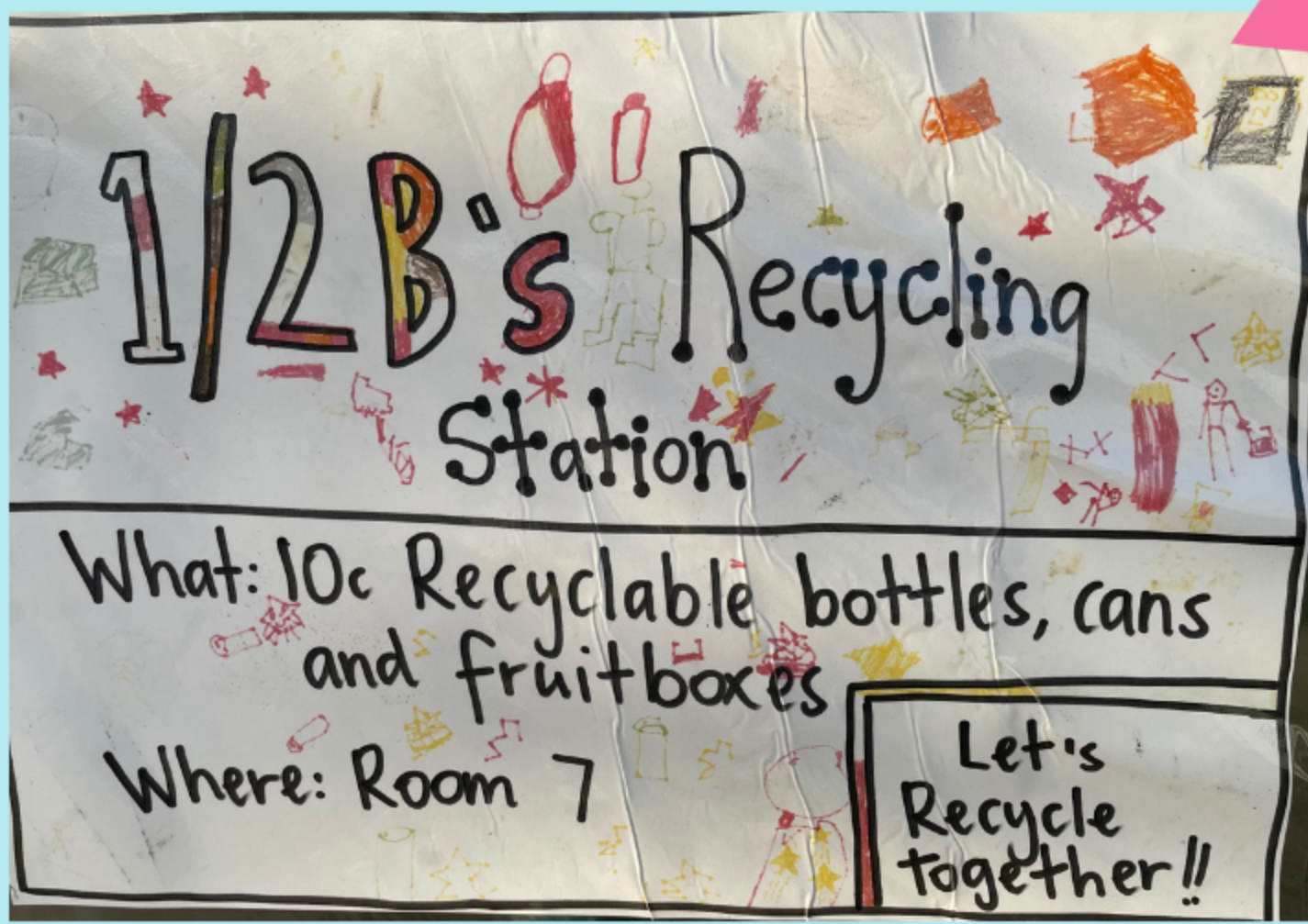
Icing

- 1 egg white
- 1 cup icing sugar
- Food colouring

METHOD

1. Preheat oven to 180 degrees and line an oven tray with baking paper.
 2. **COOKIES:** Cream butter and sugar until creamy. Add syrup and egg yolk beating until combined.
 3. Stir in flour, ginger, spice and bicarb.
 4. Place on floured surface and knead until smooth.
 5. Roll out using a rolling pin until 4mm in thickness.
 6. Cut shapes using biscuit cutters and place on baking tray.
 7. Bake for 10 minutes or until golden brown.
 8. **ICING:** Beat egg white until soft peaks form. Gradually add icing sugar and continue beating until stiff peaks form.
 9. Divide mixture and add desired food colouring.
- Once biscuits have cooled, decorate using your icing





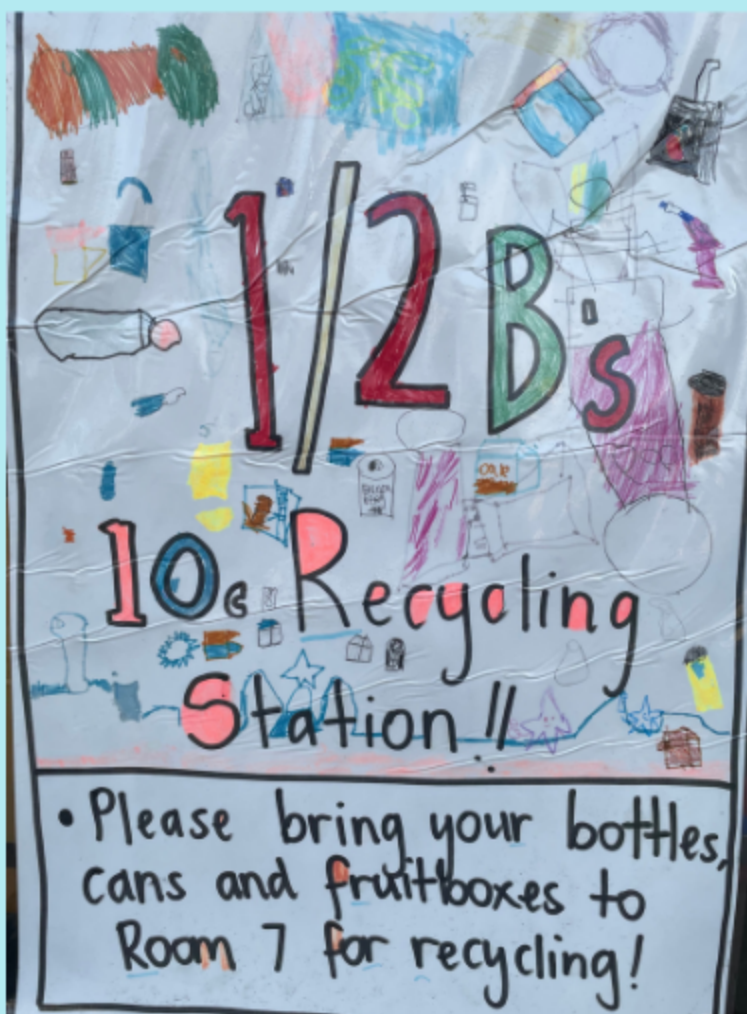
CARRANBALLAC 10c RECYCLING STATIONS

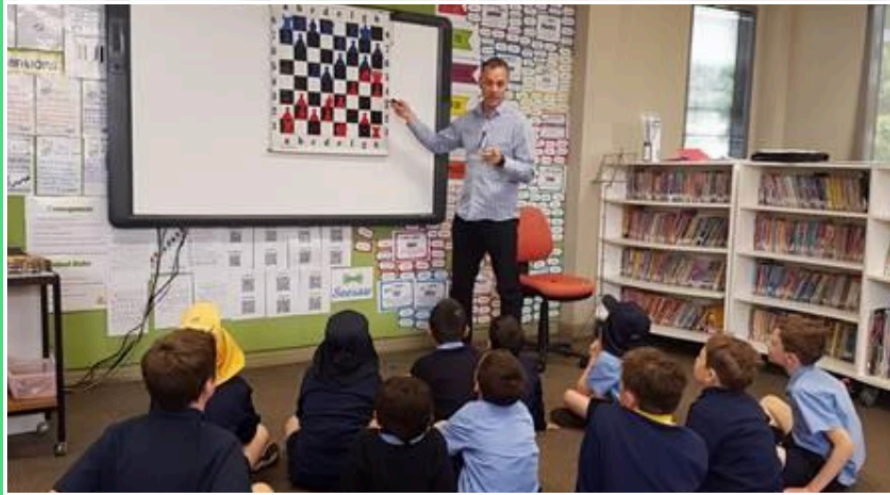
