The Importance of School Attendance – Every Day Counts!

Being at school every day is critical for your child's learning – academically, socially and physically. Every day counts - research shows that even missing one day of school per fortnight adds up to four weeks of lost learning each year. Over a child's school life, this can significantly impact their academic and social progress, confidence, and future opportunities.

At Carranballac College we monitor attendance closely to ensure every student has the best chance to succeed. As part of our process and as stipulated by the Department of Education and Training (DET), you must notify the school if your child will be absent. You can do this via a number of ways:

- Update compass with a note
- By calling the relevant campus

If your child has multiple unexplained absences, you will be contacted, and support will be provided to address any concerns. We want to support your child to have a positive year by working with you to create strong attendance routines from day one.

Mobile Phones

Students who bring a mobile phone to school must keep their phone secured in their locker throughout the day. All lockers need to have a lock. All parental/guardian contact with students should be via the school switchboard (not direct to students) during school hours, this allows students to focus on their learning.

Any mobile phones confiscated from students during the school day (i.e. not handed in voluntarily at the start of the day or stored in a locked locker) will require a parent/guardian to come to school to pick it up.

Please note that if students are purchasing food from the canteen they are not to use their mobile phones.



Information re Local Excursion Consent Form 2025

In 2025, Carranballac College may take students outside of school grounds to undertake educational activities in the local area.

The purpose of this form is to obtain parent/carer consent for local excursions during 2025.

This form does NOT provide consent for excursions that go beyond the local area.

Local Excursions

Local excursions are excursions to locations within walking distance of the school and do not involve 'Adventure Activities'.

Local excursions that your child may participate in throughout the year could include walking (or busing if weather demands) to:

- Local Shopping Centres
- Local Sporting Grounds
- Local Wetlands
- Local Parks
- The other campus of Carranballac College (Boardwalk from Jamieson Way, or Jamieson Way from Boardwalk)

Notification of Local Excursions

Carranballac College will NOT seek further consent from you before local excursions take place. However, we will provide advance notice to parents/carers of upcoming local excursions through the Compass app via news feed or emails.

For local excursions that occur on a recurring basis Carranballac College will notify parents/carers once only prior to the commencement of the recurring event, eg; weekly sports lessons at the local oval.

Please ensure you have signed up to the Compass App to receive these notifications.

If you do not sign and return this form, or if you later withdraw consent prior to an excursion, your child will not attend local excursions and will remain at school while the excursions run.

First Aid and Medical Attention

Where necessary, school staff will administer first aid. School staff will also seek emergency medical attention for your child if it is considered reasonably necessary. Any costs associated with student injury rest with parents/carers unless the Department of Education and Training is liable in negligence (liability is not automatic).

Accident and Ambulance Cover

The Department of Education and Training does not provide student accident insurance or ambulance cover. Parents may wish to obtain this cover, depending on their health insurance arrangements and any other personal considerations.

Photographing, Filming and Recording Students at Carranballac P-9 College Consent Form

This Consent Form describes:

We will also notify parents when implementing software that may include photos of students, giving parents an opportunity to discuss any concerns or preferences.

This consent form applies to images of students that are collected and used by our school.

We ask that any parents/carers or other members of our school community photographing, filming or recording students at school events (e.g. concerts, sports events etc) do so in a respectful and safe manner and that images of students are not publicly posted (e.g. to a social media account) without the permission of the relevant parent/carer.

Privacy



Camps, Sports and Excursions fund eligibility

Below are the criteria used to determine a student's eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF).

Criteria 1 – Eligibility

To be eligible* for the fund, a mature minor of sixteen years of age or over, a parent or legal guardian of a student attending a registered Government or non-government Victorian primary or secondary school must:

- · on the first day of Term one; or
- on the first day of Term two.
- a) Be an eligible beneficiary within the meaning of the State Concessions Act 2004, that is, be a holder of Veterans Affairs Gold Card or be an eligible Centrelink Health Care Card (HCC) or Pensioner Concession Card (PCC) holder; or
- b) Be a temporary foster parent; and
- c) Submit an application to the school by the due date.

* A special consideration eligibility category also exists. For more information, see: <u>Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund</u> (CSEF): Eligibility | education.vic.gov.au

Mature minors or parents who receive a Carer Allowance on behalf of a child, or any other benefit or allowance not income tested by Centrelink, are not eligible for the CSEF unless they also comply with one of (a) or (b) above.

Criteria 2 - Be of school age and attend school in Victoria

School is compulsory for all Victorian children aged between six and seventeen years of age inclusive.

For the purposes of CSEF, students may be eligible for assistance if they attend a Victorian registered primary or secondary school. Typically, these students are aged between five and eighteen years inclusive.

CSEF is not payable to students' attending pre-school, kindergarten, home schooling, or TAFE.

Eligibility Date

For concession card holders, CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/legal guardian's concession card being successfully validated with Centrelink (see <u>Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF): Policy | education.vic.gov.au</u>).

Payment amounts

CSEF payment amount

The CSEF is an annual payment to the school to be used towards camps, sports and/or excursion expenses for the benefit of the eligible student.

The CSEF is paid directly the school and will be allocated by the school towards camps, sports and/or excursion costs for your child. Please refer to the policy for the current rates.

Foundation and Year 7 government school students who are CSEF recipients are also eligible for a uniform voucher. Schools are required to make applications on behalf of parents, so please register your interest at the school.

How to complete the application form

NOTE: ALL SECTIONS MUST BE COMPLETED BY PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN

- Complete the PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN DETAILS section. Make sure that the Surname, First Name, and Customer Reference Number (CRN) details match those on your concession card. You will also need to provide your concession card to the school.
 If you are claiming as a Foster Parent or a Veteran Affairs Pensioner, you will need to provide a copy of documentation confirming your status as a temporary Foster Parent or provide your Veterans Affairs Pensioner Gold card to the school.
- 2. Complete the STUDENT/S DETAILS section for students at this school.
- 3. Sign and date the form and return it to the school office as soon as possible.

CSEF payments cannot be claimed retrospectively for prior years.
