First Nations Artist in Residence

Our Year 8 students are currently participating in a powerful and meaningful program through our Artist in Residence initiative. First Nations artist Tiffany Hunter, of Nerdu Badji Education, is guiding students through a series of cultural sessions exploring Indigenous art, symbols, storytelling, and identity.

Students are contributing their ideas to a collaborative mural based on the theme "djeembana" (meeting place), which will become a lasting symbol of inclusion, connection, and cultural respect within our school. They are also producing their own canvas artworks representing personal and cultural identity, which will be exhibited during NAIDOC Week. This experience has not only enriched our curriculum, but has also deepened students' appreciation for culture and diversity—values we hold central to our community.

Review of Secondary Consequence System

As a college, we are deeply committed to listening to our students and evolving to meet their needs. In response to student feedback, we have commenced a review of the secondary consequence system. 

Grade 3/4 - Mathematics Shape Cities

SECONDARY JAPANESE




SEMESTER 1

Year 7 & 8



This semester, Year 7 students have been learning the hiragana script through creative mnemonics. They designed their own flashcards with pictures to help them remember each character. Students practised reading, writing, and listening through fun class activities and dictation games.

+ Year 8



Our Year 8 students began the year by consolidating the hiragana writing system, including extended characters such as blends, small \supset , and voiced sounds. Students then explored the world of Japanese cuisine, conducting research on a traditional or modern dish of their choice. Finally, students learned key grammar patterns to express their likes and dislikes, enabling them to talk about their food preferences in Japanese.


A STRONG WEEK AT BOARDWALK


Our Boardwalk Campus had a fantastic week from start to finish, managing to have more than 88% of all students attending each day.

QUESTION QUEST: DEVELOPING INQUIRY AND UNDERSTANDING

This week, we're on a "Question Quest" – focusing on the amazing power of asking and answering questions! These skills are vital for your child's learning, problem-solving, and connecting with others.

Why Questions Are So Powerful:

Questions help children become curious explorers, gather information, and share unique perspectives. Asking helps them learn, while answering shows what they know and builds relationships.

Tips for Parents: Helping Your Child on Their Question Quest

1. Model Open-Ended Questions

- What it is: Ask questions inviting more thought than a simple "yes" or "no."
- Why it helps: Encourages deeper thinking and more language.
- Try asking: "What do you think...?", "How did that make you feel?", "Tell me about..."

2. Encourage Thoughtful, Detailed Answers

- What it is: When your child gives a short answer, gently prompt for more information.
- Why it helps: Builds expressive language and elaboration.
- Try saying: "Tell me more about that.", "Can you give me an example?", "And then what happened?", "Why do you think that?"

3. Explore Different Question Types (The "Wh-" Words!)

- What it is: Help your child understand and use specific "Wh-" questions to get exact information.
- Why it helps: Improves their ability to inquire effectively.
- Talk about: Who, What, Where, When, Why and How.

4. Play Information-Gathering Games

- What it is: Use fun games that require asking and answering questions.
- Why it helps: Makes practice engaging and natural.
- **Game Ideas:** "Guess Who?", "20 Questions", "Interview Time" with a family member, "Mystery Bag" (ask yes/no questions to guess contents).

5. For Older Kids (Ages 11-15): Discuss the Purpose of Questions

- What it is: Talk about why we ask certain types of questions in different situations.
- Why it helps: Develops critical thinking, social awareness, and communication effectiveness.
- **Discuss:** Clarifying, Probing, Hypothetical questions, and questions for different contexts (e.g., friend vs. teacher).

Asking and answering questions effectively is a lifelong skill. By modelling, encouraging thoughtful responses, and practising in fun, everyday ways, you can help your child become a confident communicator. Keep the "Question Quest" going at home!
