Out of School Hours Care - Service Update

We wish to advise our community that TheirCare will conclude its service at Carranballac College at the end of Term 3, 2025.

We sincerely thank TheirCare for their partnership and the support they have provided to our students and families.

School Council has endorsed Carranballac College engaging Quantin Binnah Community Centre as our new before and after school hours care provider, commencing Term 4, 2025. 


















JVN 3/4 CAMP RECOUNT



Bullying No Way Week – Brainstorm Productions Performance

As part of our school's activities for **Bullying No Way Week**, students from Foundation to Year 6 attended a live theatre performance on Thursday 14 August, presented by **Brainstorm Productions**.

The show, *Being Brave* follows the story of Fly, a young boy coping with his parents' separation, who learns that real courage comes from sharing feelings and connecting with others. The performance explores themes of bullying, friendship, resilience, online safety and loss. Together, their stories highlighted the importance of empathy, support and finding strength by working together.

Key themes covered, were:

What bullying looks like in different forms, including verbal, physical and online.

The impact bullying can have on individuals and school communities.

Strategies students can use to manage conflict, seek help, and build respectful friendships.

The importance of being an *upstander* – speaking up and supporting others, rather than standing by.

Through the focus on 'Bullying No Way, Week!, students discussed the role they play in creating a safe and supportive school environment. This performance was an excellent way to reinforce the lessons we continue to teach about respect, inclusion and standing together against bullying.

FOOD TECHNOLOGY IS BACK AT JAMIESON WAY!

Year 7:

Our Year 7 students have been busy exploring measurement and baking, starting with delicious cornflake cookies (see recipe below). These cookies can easily be adapted with dried berries, nuts, or chocolate chips. One creative group even shaped their cookies into mini donuts! This activity encouraged them to recognise and balance different flavour profiles. Then we applied our skills to make muffins and adding various ingredients to change the texture and flavour. Here we have a team that placed a teaspoonful of jam in the middle of their donuts and created an extra layer of flavour.



Year 8:

In preparation for the Year 8 burger design assessment in Week 8, students practiced by making burgers and considering how to include all five food groups while enhancing flavour. They also made apple crumble and discussed the importance of sourcing local produce and the positive impact this has on our community



MKR:

Our MKR students have also shown fantastic creativity. They designed super salads using ingredients like potato, rice, beans, egg, bacon, chicken, and plenty of fresh produce, complemented by homemade dressings to elevate the flavour. To finish, they took on the challenge of designing a dish featuring seasonal ingredients such as pumpkin, leek, onion, mandarin, lamb, and prawns, highlighting the value of cooking with what's in season.



RECIPE: CORNFLAKE COOKIES

Preparation Time: 20 minutes
Makes: 12



IT'S BEEN A DELICIOUSLY BUSY TERM IN FOOD TECHNOLOGY!

INGREDIENTS:

- 125g butter
- ½ C caster sugar
- 1 egg
- 1 C self-raising flour
- 2 T sultanas
- 2 C cornflakes

METHOD:

1.Preheat oven to 180 degrees.

2.Line a baking try with baking paper.

3.Beat butter and sugar in a bowl until pale and creamy. Beat in egg. Fold in flour, sultanas and a pinch of salt and mix until well combined.

4.Place cornflakes in a bowl. Spoon heaped tablespoons of mixture into the cornflakes and toss gently forming balls.

5.Place the balls 8 cm apart on prepared tray. Bake for 15 mins or until golden.

Cool biscuits on tray for 5 mins before transferring to a wire rack to cool completely.
